This example of a traditional deer antler crown handle Scottish Sgian Dubh made by John Nowill & Sons, Sheffield, England has a grooved blade length 3.68" (93mm) width 0.68" (21mm) thickness 0.1" (2.4mm) tapering to a spear point. **Provenance:** The SGIAN-DUBH was reputed to have been carried by some members of the New Zealand Forest Rangers 1863-67 and some members of the Armed Constabulary Field Force from 1867-1886 and by the various New Zealand Highland Rifle Volunteers from 1885.



The notched back grooved blade is marked J. NOWILL & SONS / SHEFFIELD, the deer antler crowned handle has a metal button cap.



The flat leather sheath is held against the leg by the hose (stocking) with the antler crown just protruding from the right leg stocking top.

A short knife developed and used over centuries in Scotland and by Scots worldwide. Fitted with a stag crowned antler handle for field use. In dress form traditionally surmounted with a Cairngorm, semi precious quartz crystal stone found on the Scottish Cairngorm Mountains. It is still considered high fashion and appropriate to wear a Dirk and Sgian Dubh as part of Highland Dress to any formal occasion in New Zealand.
