Early Leanders (F 104 & F 55) were developed from improvements to Rothesay Class; later Leanders (F 421 & F 69) were 2 feet wider in the beam and 2 knots slower.

Waikato and Canterbury were ordered in 6/63 and 8/68 to replace Royalist and Loch Class frigates. Following completion and workup both ships sailed to NZ via Panama arriving in 6/67 and 8/72. HMS Bacchante and Dido were purchased from the RN in 1981 to replace Otago & Taranaki, they were renamed Wellington and Southland. These last two ships arriving in NZ via Panama in 12/82 and 7/84, delivery of Wellington being delayed by the Falklands War.

All four frigates undertook exercises, training and port visits around New Zealand. *Canterbury* relieved *Otago* in protesting French nuclear testing at Mururoa in July '73 and took part in the Spithead Silver Jubilee Royal Fleet Naval Review in June '77. *Canterbury* and *Waikato* both served on patrols in the Indian Ocean between 6/82 and 10/83 relieving RN ships to the Falkland War. *Canterbury* attended the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of Crete in 1991 and served in the Persian Gulf in '96 and East Timor in 1999 during INTERFET. Both *Wellington* and *Canterbury* were deployed to Fiji during the first military coup of 1987, in '94 both ships were deployed to Bougainville as part of the peace keeping initiative and in '95 *Wellington* was involved in blockading Iraq in the Persian Gulf. With the exception of *Southland* all the Leanders undertook major mid-life refits and modernisation.

Southland was decommissioned in 1995 and was broken up at Goa, India. Waikato was decommissioned in 1998 and sunk as a dive site off Tutakaka, Northland on 18/12/2000. Wellington decommissioned in 1999 and sunk as a dive site at Haughton Bay, near Wellington on 13/11/2005. Canterbury was decommissioned in 2005 and was scuttled as a dive site at Deepwater Cove, Northland on 3/11/2007.
