

Pattern: Browning No1 Model 1900. Caliber: 7.65x17mm. Introduced: 1917. Withdrawn NZ use: after WWI

**Specifications:** Manufactured by Fabrique Nationale d'Herstal (FN) 1900 to 1914, approximately 700,000 made. Caliber 7.65x17 (Browning). Action: semi automatic blowback. Length: 172mm. Weight 625g. Barrel length: 102mm barrel is fixed to the frame. The recoil spring is located within the slide and above the barrel. This spring, via a special lever also acts as a firing pin spring. Box magazine capacity 7 cartridges. Sights: half round blade front sight, vee rear sight. Cartridge ejection port cut into frame on left side. Lanyard retaining loop at lower left rear of frame. Holster: Brown pigskin with spare magazine.

The first semi-automatic blowback operated pistol was designed by American John Moses Browning in 1896 modified in 1897, 1899 and after a few more modifications was adopted by the Belgium Military as Mle.1900. The Browning M1900 was issued to some German forces during WWI particularly in Belgium and France.



**New Zealand use.** This FN made Browning M1900 No1 pistol was taken from a captured German soldier at Messiness Ridge in June 1917 by an infantry private in the New Zealand Expeditionary Division who carried it as a backup pistol for the remainder of the war. Many captured pistols were brought back to New Zealand as war prize guns with the returning troops.
